Concept knowledge — a powerful predictor of language development, cognitive functioning, and school readiness — involves comprehension of basic concepts used in daily classroom conversations, teacher directions, and the school's curriculum.

The Bracken Basic Concept Scale (4th ed.): Receptive™ (BBCS-4:R™) is a comprehensive measure used to assess children's understanding of basic concepts across 10 subtests: colors, letters, numbers/counting, sizes/ comparisons, shapes, self-/social awareness, directions/ position, texture/material, quantity, and time/ sequence. Clinical and research information provided by the BBCS–4:R is especially important for school, child, developmental, and clinical psychologists who assess developmental delays and many other early childhood disabilities (e.g., autism, selective mutism, hearing impairments) in young children, as well other professionals assessing a child to evaluate concept understanding or school readiness.
